



Have you considered planning an assembly using "For the Record" video?

You had the opportunity to view this 20-minute video here at the workshop and hopefully realize its impact. The video comes with a facilitation guide, which covers in more detail the following points on "How to Present 'For the Record' at An Assembly".

The video covers various topics such as:

- alcohol intoxication
- alcohol poisoning
- marijuana use
- sexual assault while intoxicated

The video is available at your school or through your local Public Health Nurse.

How to Present "For the Record" at An Assembly

1. The assembly should start with a brief introduction to the video.
2. You may want to warn your peers of the graphic nature of the alcohol poisoning scene and the use of swearing throughout.
3. This presentation does not assume that all youth have unsafe or excessive drinking patterns. It does, however, encourage all partygoers to address safety issues, whether they are drinking or not!
4. The video should be followed by a discussion. Your discussion should cover all pertinent areas related to intoxication including:
 - Discuss the audience's previous experiences with parties like the one in the video
 - Symptoms of alcohol poisoning
 - How to prevent alcohol poisoning
 - What to do if you suspect someone has alcohol poisoning
 - Consequences of drinking too much alcohol
