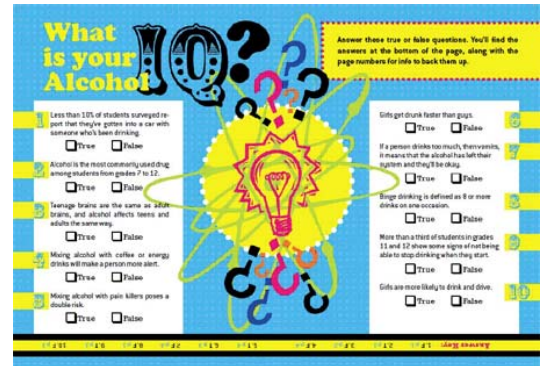

HAVE FUN, BUT DON'T GET CARRIED AWAY. Make smart choices about drinking. Better safe than stupid.

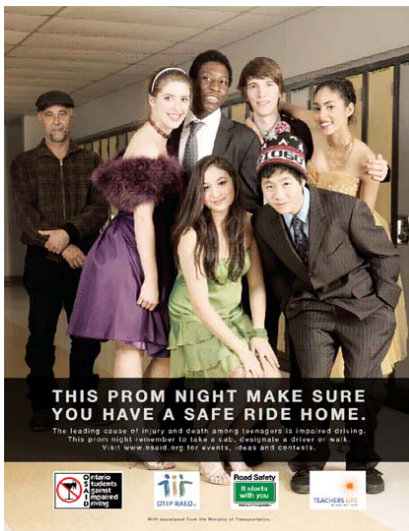
